The average salary range for project managers can vary significantly based on factors such as experience, location, company size, and the specific role and responsibilities within each sector. And these figures may also vary with time and individual sector demand. It's essential to consult up-to-date salary data or industry-specific resources for the most current information. Nevertheless, here's a general order of pay expectation for project managers in the listed sectors.
