

UK Provides £5 Million to UNICEF for Lebanon Humanitarian Response

The UK government has announced a £5 million contribution to UNICEF to support humanitarian response efforts in Lebanon. This funding comes in the wake of recent air strikes that have resulted in further civilian casualties and displacement.

The essential humanitarian support will provide medical supplies, hygiene kits, and fuel for water stations to assist thousands of displaced civilians across Lebanon. It will also enable emergency teams to address urgent health and nutrition needs and provide training to frontline workers.

"Alongside our tireless diplomatic efforts, the UK is providing £5m to UNICEF Lebanon, to deliver vital supplies to support thousands of displaced civilians facing a humanitarian emergency in Lebanon. The UK has been and will remain a strong supporter of Lebanon."
