The State of Green Project Management 2024: Insights & Trends

Sustainability is becoming a cornerstone of project management. The latest findings from the Green Project Management (GPM) Research Initiative highlight the growing need to integrate environmental considerations into project strategies.

The data is clear: climate change is already affecting project outcomes. In 2024, 53% of projects reported disruptions due to extreme weather, up from 38% in 2021. The urgency to adopt sustainable, resilient practices has never been greater.

Sustainability as a Competitive Advantage

Sustainability isn't just ethical—it's strategic. A remarkable 73% of project professionals rank sustainability as a top priority, recognising its role in long-term success. Yet, 79% believe the industry isn't doing enough to combat climate change. This gap between awareness and action underscores the need for stronger implementation.

While challenges like resource scarcity and regulatory changes pose risks, they also create opportunities for innovation. Sustainable project management can enhance risk management, improve efficiency, and position organisations for long-term resilience.
