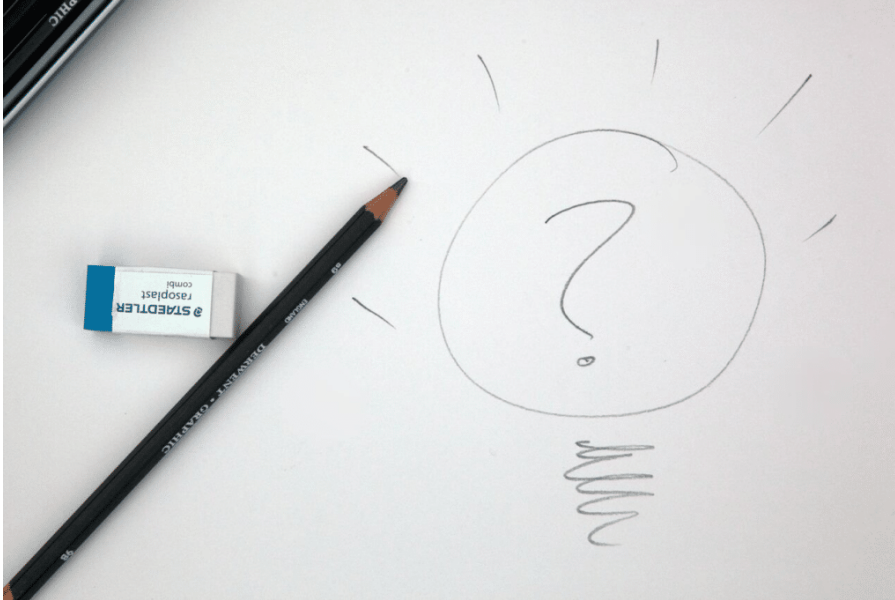

Moving into program management presents a myriad of exciting opportunities for professionals seeking to broaden their impact and influence within an organization.

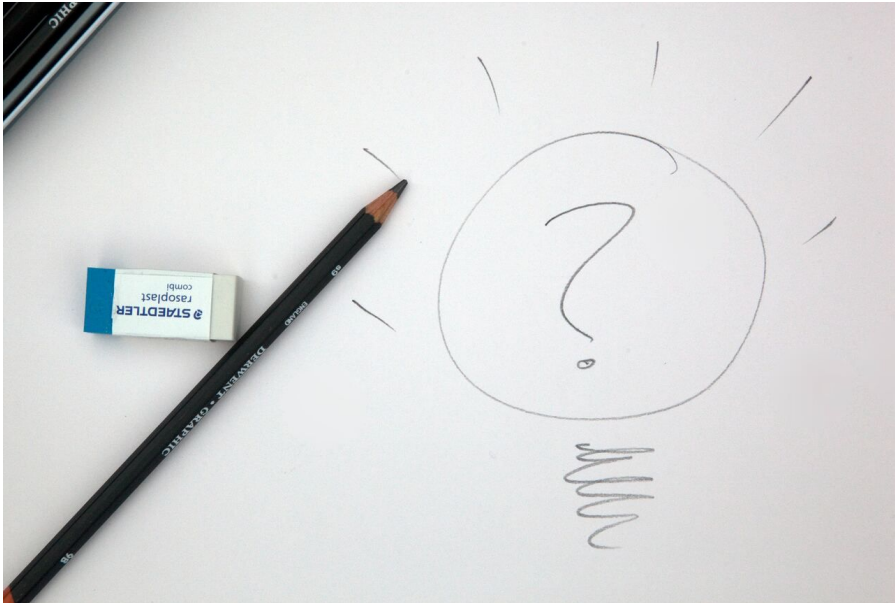

However, the rewards in terms of both salary improvement, personal autonomy and professional impact are just a few of the reasons why so many PMs are wanting to take this route of progression in their careers.

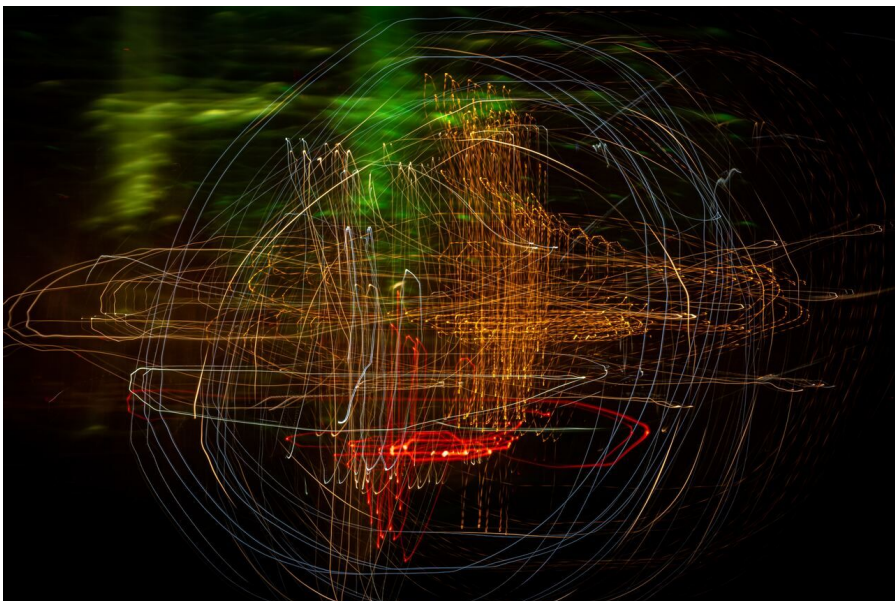
