OpenAl's latest update lets ChatGPT pull directly from GitHub issues, discussions, and documentation. It's more than a feature — it marks a shift in how Al participates in research.

Now, when you ask a question, you might get back not just code snippets, but live threads where developers debate trade-offs and implementation quirks. It turns ChatGPT into a research partner that reasons through complexity, not just recalls facts.

For teams, it means less trawling through forums and more time for real problem-solving. In the built environment, we imagine this eventually helping navigate fragmented standards and compliance documents — with Al assembling the context, not just quoting it.

Access is live for ChatGPT Team users, rolling out to Plus and Pro soon. The UK's still waiting.

Caveat: source quality matters. Flux's take? Trust the model, but verify the trail.
