

# Subsea7 Awarded Major Contract Offshore Saudi Arabia

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**Subsea7, a global leader in seabed-to-surface engineering, has announced the award of a major contract from Aramco for facilities located offshore Saudi Arabia. The contract is part of a long-term agreement between the two companies.**

The project, which Subsea7 defines as being valued between **\$750 million (£630m) and \$1.25 billion (£1.05bn)**, involves the engineering, procurement, construction, and installation (EPCI) of **106 kilometres** of infield and export pipelines. It also includes modifications to existing topsides and associated hook-up activities.

Project management and engineering work will begin immediately at Subsea7's offices in Saudi Arabia and the UAE. Offshore activities are scheduled for **2027 and 2028**.

**David Bertin, Senior Vice President for Subsea7 Global Projects Centre East, said:** "This project marks another important milestone and reinforces our long-term strategic engagement with Aramco. We look forward to working closely with the client to deliver this project safely, efficiently, and to the highest standards."

The latest award follows a recent **"significant" contract** from the Turkish Petroleum Offshore Technology Centre for a project in the Black Sea, which includes the EPCI of subsea umbilicals, risers, and flowlines. In July, the company also secured a contract from **Equinor** for the Fram Sør development project offshore Norway.
