

Al Boosting Productivity and Profitability for UK Businesses, APM Survey Finds

Artificial intelligence is delivering clear productivity and financial gains for UK organisations, according to new research from the Association for Project Management (APM).

A survey of **500 senior business leaders**, conducted by APM with Censuswide, found that **44**% report a positive impact on their bottom line from AI, compared with just **20**% who have seen a negative effect.

Productivity improvements are also being widely felt. **43**% of leaders say Al is enhancing productivity across their organisation or parts of it, while only **13**% report a decline. A further **18**% remain uncertain about its effects.

Strongest Gains in Technology and Financial Services

The productivity boost is most pronounced in the **Technology** sector, where **56%** of leaders say Al is improving performance. Other sectors also report significant gains:

Leaders seeing a positive productivity impact:

- ∘ Technology (56%)
- Financial Services (54%)
- Energy (50%)
- Central/Local Government (44%)
- Manufacturing (42%)



- Transport and Logistics (40%)
- Healthcare (40%)
- Engineering (40%)
- Aerospace and Defence (38%)
- Construction (28%)

Technology leaders also report the strongest financial returns, with **71%** citing a positive impact on profitability.

Leaders seeing a positive bottom-line impact:

- Technology (71%)
- Manufacturing (51%)
- Healthcare (51%)
- Financial Services (50%)
- Transport and Logistics (49%)
- Construction (48%)
- Central/Local Government (38%)
- Energy (31%)
- Engineering (29%)
- Aerospace and Defence (20%)

Among those who have seen productivity gains, the areas benefitting most are IT (15%), Finance/Accounting (14%), and Research and Development and Customer Service (both 12%).

Barriers for Organisations Seeing Negative Impacts

For the minority reporting declining productivity, the most common issues include:

- Overly broad scope (12%)
- Failure to apply lessons from previous implementations (11%)
- Integration challenges (10%)
- Lack of internal skills or budget for support (10%)
