

Tutor Perini secures \$61.6m U.S. Coast Guard project in Alaska

Tutor Perini Corporation has been awarded a contract worth approximately \$61.6 million by the U.S. Coast Guard to design and construct a new Child Development Center at USCG Base Kodiak in Alaska.

The project, awarded to Tutor Perini subsidiary Perini Management Services, Inc. (PMSI), adds to the company's growing federal infrastructure portfolio and reflects continued investment in military and government support facilities across the United States.

The contract will see PMSI deliver a new 34,000-square-foot childcare facility with capacity for 232 children, alongside extensive supporting infrastructure works.

Full design-build delivery model

The project will be delivered under a design-build structure, with PMSI responsible for both planning and construction activities throughout the programme lifecycle.

In addition to the main facility, the scope of work includes:

- site development
- utility installation
- outdoor play areas
- parking infrastructure

- supporting operational improvements

The project also includes demolition of existing housing structures, environmental compliance activities, permitting and regulatory approvals.

Work is expected to begin in May 2026, with substantial completion targeted for January 2029.

The contract value will be added to Tutor Perini's backlog during the second quarter of 2026.

Federal projects continue driving construction pipeline

The award highlights the continuing role of federal and defence-related infrastructure programmes in supporting the North American construction and project delivery market.

Military and government facilities increasingly require integrated project delivery capability, particularly in remote or operationally complex locations such as Alaska, where logistics, environmental compliance and workforce coordination create additional programme management challenges.

For project professionals, the Kodiak development reflects the growing importance of multidisciplinary delivery models combining design, engineering, environmental oversight and construction execution under a single contractor framework.

Complex delivery environment

Projects in remote regions such as Alaska typically present elevated delivery risks linked to climate conditions, supply chain coordination, permitting requirements and construction scheduling.

The inclusion of demolition, utility works and environmental compliance activities further increases project complexity, placing greater emphasis on planning, sequencing and stakeholder coordination throughout the delivery programme.

Tutor Perini said the project aligns with its wider expertise in delivering complex civil, building and specialty construction projects for public sector clients.

Expanding government infrastructure focus

The company continues to maintain a significant presence across government, military and public infrastructure programmes through a mix of design-build, construction management and public-private partnership delivery models.

Tutor Perini's broader portfolio includes large-scale transportation, civil infrastructure, defence and institutional developments across the United States and internationally.

The company stated that its long-standing reputation has been built around delivering complex projects while maintaining strict safety, quality and schedule controls.

For the wider project sector, the Kodiak award reinforces how public infrastructure investment continues to generate long-term opportunities for firms with integrated project management, engineering and construction delivery capability.
